Woldemariam and Shifrinson Join CISSM and SPP as Senior Fellows, Associate Professors

Shifrinson are joining CISSM and the School of Public Policy this fall term as senior fellows and associate professors, respectively. Woldemariam brings a wealth of expertise on civil conflict in Africa to augment the research agenda driving CISSM's **Civil Violence** and **Human Security** projects. Shifrinson's extensive research on great power competition, NATO expansion, and the rise of China will add new perspectives to CISSM's **Nuclear Past, Present and Future** and **U.S.- Russian Security Relations** projects.

First Ever CISSM *Iran Update* Surveys Iranian Views on War in Ukraine, Nuclear Options



CISSM released its first **Iran Update**, a smaller addition (focused on policy-relevant and time-sensitive questions) to CISSM's larger Iranian public opinion survey series. The interim report entitled "**Iranian Public Opinion on the War in Ukraine and Nuclear Options**" found a clear majority still reject nuclear weapons, while less than half think the JCPOA will be restored despite a large majority believing restoring the JCPOA would benefit the Iranian economy. On Ukraine, a clear majority see Russia's attack as illegitimate aggression and not in self-defense though Iranians are divided over whether their government should do more to oppose the war.

Multi-stakeholder partnerships among states and nonstate actors have become increasingly prevalent models for the delivery of global public goods. Various international organizations—particularly the United Nations entities—are pouring resources into large-scale efforts such as conferences and summits to promote partnerships. Are such efforts effective? CISSM affiliate, **Dr. Poorti Sapatnekar**, argues that these efforts can be effective when organizational attributes align and facilitate collective choreography in her new CISSM Working Paper, **"Global Governance 2.0: The Collective Choreography of Cooperation."**

## CISSM Experts Share Perspectives on War in Ukraine



How does the Russian invasion of Ukraine affect European and global security? What does it mean for the rules-based order and democracy? What are the implications for NATO and collective defense? What might a protracted struggle look like? How does Putin maintain his power? These are some of the questions that CISSM scholars address in the newly launched "CISSM Perspectives on the Russia - Ukraine War" webpage. Featured items include Professor Alec Worsnop's analysis of the prospects for Ukrainian insurgency against Russia and viewpoints from CISSM Director Nancy Gallagher and new CISSM Senior Fellow and SPP Professor, Joshua Shifrinson, on the implications of Finland and Sweden NATO accession and the likelihood of nuclear escalation.

Implications of North Korea's Ambiguous Nuclear Posture for Proliferation Risks



**Dr. Ariel Petrovics** and co-author, Dr. Hyun-Binn Cho, Assistant Professor at The College of New Jersey, published their first article for an ongoing research project examining nuclear proliferation risks. *The Washington Quarterly* article entitled "North Korea's **Strategically Ambiguous Nuclear Posture**" lays out an organizational framework to help analysts and policymakers make sense of the security implications of North Korea's ambiguous nuclear strategy. Petrovics recently won the **2022 CISSM Seed Grant** competition to help fund follow-up research on how North Korea's nuclear strategy influences South Korean public opinion on developing its own nuclear program.

Research on Russian Motives for the Use of Force Awarded Yamamoto-Scheffelin Dissertation Prize



Recent SPP graduate, **Chris Hickey**, was awarded the Yamamoto-Scheffelin Dissertation prize for AY 2021-2022. The award recognizes his research examining the motives behind the Russian Federation's decisions to use force since the end of the Cold War. Hickey's **dissertation** entitled "Assessing Motives for Russian Federation Use and Non-use of Force: An Approach to Improve the Strategic Planning and Policy of the United States" builds on his extensive background in military strategic planning and design thinking and is particularly timely given Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.

Shortcomings and Geopolitical Costs of National Missile Defense



Can the United States' Ground-based Micdourse Defense (GMD) system protect the U.S. homeland from North Korean ICBMs? CISSM affiliates, **Jaganath Sankaran** and **Steve Fetter**, argue that GMD is incapable of providing reliable defense against North Korea. The authors argue that GMD imposes high geopolitical costs by negatively impacting strategic stability with Russia and China in their new article published in *International Security*, "Defending the United States: Revisiting National Missile Defense against North Korea"
